John Mayer makes significant donation to support redwood parks

Crescent City, Calif. – Musician John Mayer recently made a \$10,000 contribution to Redwood Parks Conservancy, the official non-profit partner to Redwood National and State Parks, to support its mission of protecting and preserving the world’s tallest trees.

John was in Crescent City, CA in 2020 to film a Land Rover commercial in Redwood National and State Parks. When the production company that had promised a donation to the Conservancy did not follow through, John came to the rescue after being asked for help in contacting them. Instead, he gave a personal donation to the redwood parks through his charitable foundation.

John also recently came to the aid of the community in Big Sky Country by asking for the public’s help in response to the historic flooding that caused Yellowstone National Park to close for several weeks. Mayer shared that the community he has called home in Park County, Montana, was struggling amidst the mass cancellations of trips to the area. Located near a park entrance, Park County depends heavily on tourism so John asked that people keep their plans to visit the area and enjoy the beauty and other landmarks the area has to offer.

Redwood Parks Conservancy (RPC), is a non-profit organization that supports the educational and preservation mission at Redwood National and State Parks, Smith River National Recreation Area, Tolowa Dunes State Park, Sue-meg State Park, Fort Humboldt State Park, and other state parks along California's north coast.
